Three Establishments Cited for Selling to Minors

TUSCOLA – Three Douglas County establishments were cited Wednesday for liquor license violations after they allegedly sold alcohol to minors as part of an undercover operation conducted by Illinois Liquor Control Commission (ILCC) agents and the Tuscola and Arcola police departments.

During Wednesday’s operation, three of 11 establishments checked sold alcohol to underage minors, including:

Fuel Mart	1207 US RT 36	Tuscola
Dog House Bar & Grill	126 N. Oak St.	Arcola
It’ll Do	106 N. Oak St.	Arcola

All were cited by agents and each will be referred to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission for action. The penalties for selling alcohol to minors can include fines and/or liquor license suspension or revocation.

“Under-age drinking is a serious problem, and our licensees know the rules,” said Lainie Krozel, Executive Director of the ILCC. “They should be checking the IDs of these kids.”

The undercover operations are part of ongoing statewide checks made throughout the year to assure compliance with the law that prohibits the sale of alcohol to minors.
