Enterprise Zones, Foreign Trade Zones, and Sub-Zones

Enterprise zones are economically distressed areas in Illinois, of 12 to 15 square miles, that qualify for special tax incentives once they are designated by the state and participating local governments.

Portions of the municipalities and counties listed have been designated as enterprise zones. For further information about any particular zone, please contact the local zone administrator.

Foreign or "free" trade zones or subzones are secured areas legally outside a nation's customs territory. Their purpose is to attract and promote international trade or commerce. In Illinois, foreign trade zones are located in portions of Chicago, Granite City, Peoria, Rock Island, and Moline.
