This course introduces the student to the key county officials that deal with property tax and covers the duties and responsibilities of their offices. Students will gain a basic understanding of the property tax process. The two-year tax cycle is examined, focusing on the assessment, budget and levy, and collection process, including judgment and sale of delinquent property taxes. This course may be used as an elective for CIAO qualification or for continuing education credit.
